Provided below is the link to the Commercial Vehicle Safety Alliance (CVSA) website indicating the scheduled 2017, 72-hour inspection blitz commonly referred to as "International Roadcheck". International Roadcheck is a CVSA program organized in partnership with the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration, Canadian Council of Motor Transport Administrators, Transport Canada and the Secretariat of Communications and Transportation (Mexico). Starting June 6th and ending June 8th, state, local and federal inspectors will occupy inspection stations throughout North America, from Canada to Mexico and perform Commercial Motor Vehicle inspections. This is the largest targeted annual enforcement campaign on trucks and bus-es. Each year, approximately 10,000 CVSA-certified local, state, provincial and federal inspectors in every jurisdiction across North America perform the truck and bus inspections (CVSA, 2017).

The special emphasis for this years International Roadcheck 2017 is cargo securement (i.e. Failure to secure cargo and equipment, loss of loads or failure to prevent shifting loads, damaged tie-downs, insufficient number of tie –downs, unknown capacity of tie-downs and loose tie-downs).

Not only could Roadcheck 2017 have negative logistical impacts on your operations, it can also significantly impact your commercial motor vehicle (CMV) safety performance history on the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration's (FMCSA) Safety Management System(SMS) web site. The site which is public record, combines current and historical safety performance information to measure the relative safety fitness of commercial motor carriers. This information includes Federal and State data on crashes, roadside inspections, on-site compliance review results and enforcement history.

The Safety Measurement System (SMS) evaluates the safety of individual motor carriers by considering all safety-based roadside inspection violations, out-of-service violations as well as State-reported crashes by using 24 months of performance data. SMS assesses motor carriers' safety performance in each of seven Behavior Analysis and Safety Improvement Categories (BASICs): Unsafe Driving, Fatigued Driving (Hours-of-Service), Driver Fitness, Controlled Substances and Alcohol, Vehicle Maintenance, Cargo-Related, and Crash Indicator (FMCSA).
